**David Balch**—a successful Salinas attorney was wondering if God was calling him for a change or a new direction in his career. Ten years ago, a drunk driver killed David's son, Sebastian; David and his wife had to learn the difficult lesson of trusting in God in the middle of this tragedy. Last year, diagnosed with Stage 3 cancer, David had to rely on that trust. His faith gave him peace while facing cancer and it did lead his career into a new direction.



**Gen Camocamo** left a good job in the Philippines teaching in college and managing its special education center and is now in her 8th year here in the USA. She works in one of the Salinas school districts as a speech language pathologist, where she serves children with special needs. Together with her family, she embarked on the journey to respond to God's call and go "where she is needed the most." Initially all alone in an unfamiliar culture, Gen depended entirely on her faith and new friends.



**Dan McGinty**— Director of the institute for character formation and practical ethics at the University of Portland. In following Mother Teresa's words, "*Like Jesus, we belong to the world living not for ourselves but for others. The joy of the Lord is our strength,*" Dan's professional journey led to an intersection where past work did not necessarily point toward predictable future paths. Dan's discernment included university athletics and opportunities to partner with a philanthropy to award \$1.2M to faith-based, unsung heroes in Chicago, Peru and India.
